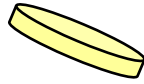


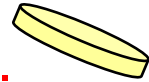


## Puzzle time

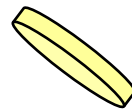
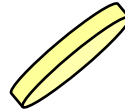
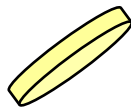
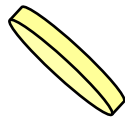
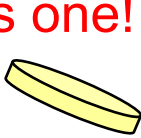
### Loose change

You may need to raid your piggy bank or find some other loose change to help you answer this one!

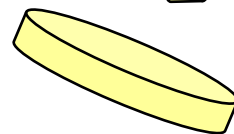
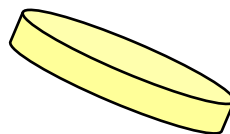
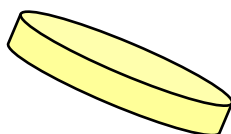
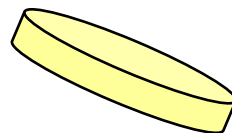
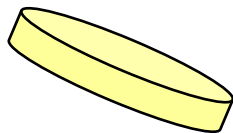


I have a whole load of coins in my pocket, but I do not have exact change for one pound.

What is the maximum possible amount of change I could have in my pocket if I do not have any £2 coins?

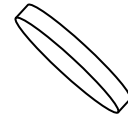


Remember there are 1p, 2p, 5p, 10p, 20p, 50p, £1.





## Puzzle time

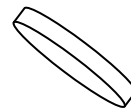


### Change for a pound - answer.

I have a whole load of coins in my pocket, but I do not have exact change for one pound.

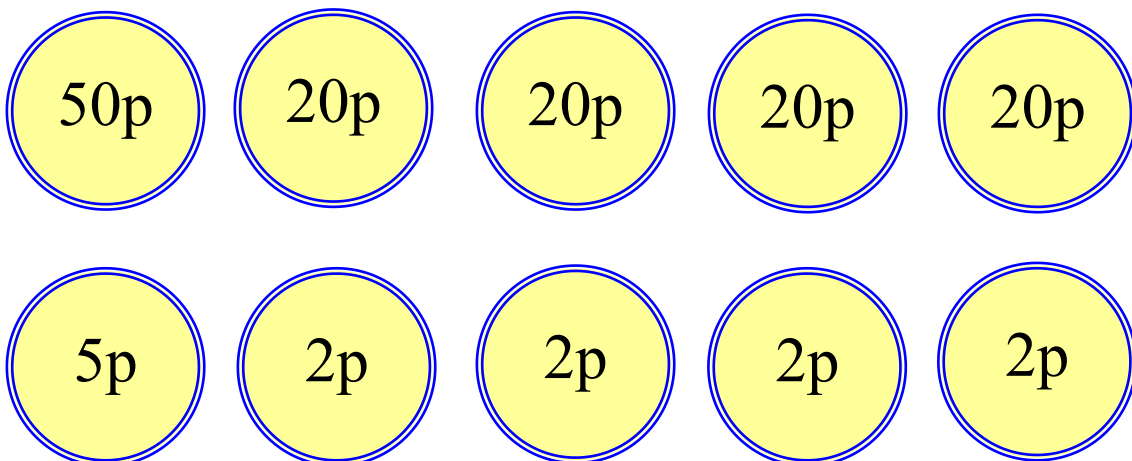


What is the maximum possible amount of change I could have in my pocket?

So, we think that the answer is: ten coins with these amounts:



This comes to **£1.43**
